PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, TREASURER, 2 BOARD OF DIRECTOR & 6 DELEGATE POSITIONS UP FOR ELECTION AT 2017 ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the Nebraska State Assembly will be held on March 4, 2017 at Bryan Health East Campus in Lincoln. Offices that will be up for election are President, Vice President, Treasurer and 2 Board of Directors. Each of these positions will be elected for a 2 year term. Eligibility for the office of President requires completion of at least one full term as a director or officer during the previous six years on the Board of Directors as well as one year of prior active membership status (being a member of AST and a current CST). Eligibility for the offices of Vice President and Treasurer requires one year of prior active membership status (being a member of AST and a current CST) while

director positions require one year of membership status where a portion of the year can include membership as a student but at the time of election the member must be a current CST as well as a member of AST. Members wishing to step up and serve the the Nebraska State Assembly will need to complete a consent to serve and curriculum vitae which can be found on the Nebraska State Assembly website at http://ne.ast.org/ These forms should then be sent to state assembly president Casey Glassburner at cglassburner@southeast.edu. We will also be electing 6 delegates and 6 alternates who will represent the Nebraska State Assembly at the 2017 AST National Conference in New Orleans. Members can also complete paperwork and run from the floor on the day of the meeting. Please consider stepping up to serve your state assembly!
